Position of School Nurse



The Nursing Role

The person appointed to this role will attend to pupils taken ill at school and give first-aid to those suffering injury. In addition(s) he will manage and administer student medication, contribute to Health Education initiatives and liaise with Health Trust personnel engaged in immunisation programmes.

Facets of the Role

The person appointed will:-

- Manage the sick-bay and ensure that stocks of consumables are adequate and that equipment is in good working order and ready for use.
- Ensure that pupils who are admitted to the sick-bay are regularly checked whilst there and if needs be, that arrangements are made with parents or guardian to have a sick child collected early from school.
- If circumstances dictate, escort an unwell or injured pupil to hospital and remain with the child until his parent or guardian arrives.
- Administer first-aid treatment to any pupil or staff member in such need.
- Draw up a report of any accident involving a pupil or member of staff on school premises and retain on file. Enter into correspondence with insurance companies, if required.
- Refresh first-aid skills by attending an appropriate refresher course at least once every three years.
- Ensure that all first-aid boxes around the school are adequately stocked and readyfor-use.
- Contribute to Health Education initiatives as they might arise from time to time.
- Support the work of the PSHE department in areas which have health implications, e.g. Substance Misuse, Relationships and Sexuality.
- Assist where required with the distribution of lateral flow testing, track and tracing of potential cases etc within the school for the duration of the pandemic.
- Administer according to parental instruction, medications which pupils must take in the course of the school day.
- Ensure that all medical records are updated and maintained on the school data base system, SIMS.
- Part of the role will involve being part of the pastoral care team within the school to provide insight into pupils where necessary and provide support if and when needed.
- Acquire a working knowledge of relevant school policies such as, Pastoral Care, Child Protection, Bullying, Substance Misuse, Discipline, Management of Critical Incidents, Health and Safety.
- Be prepared to develop on an ongoing basis one's own counselling expertise and skills.

Skills, Experience and Qualifications

The person appointed will have:

Essential:

- Appropriate and up to date first-aid qualifications
- Experience of working with young people for a minimum of two years
- The ability to discern, in consultation with their immediate supervisor, when to extend confidentiality to appropriate others

• Have a clean driving licence and the use of a car.

Desirable:

- Appropriate nursing qualifications
- A counselling qualification

Confines and Management of the Role

The person appointed will:-

- Work under the direct supervision of a member of Senior Management
- Work within the confines of appropriate confidentiality
- Maintain secure records of visits to the sick-bay due to accidents and other causes.

Provide for the Headmaster and Board of Governors an annual report evaluating the nursing s In addition to facilitating individual students and groups in resolving problems and issues.

Working pattern:

The position is a term time (based on pupil attendance days) working on Wednesday, Thursday Friday, the hours of work are from 9am to 4pm each day. The salary for this post is £11,885
